Dear Mr. Khuzami:

This is in response to your May 8, 2015 request for the installation of a speed hump on 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue between 8<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> Streets.

Following an investigation of all the blocks, I am pleased to inform you that Crescent Street:

- Between 9<sup>th</sup> Street and 12<sup>th</sup> Street - meets the criteria for a speed hump.
- Between 14<sup>th</sup> Street and 18<sup>th</sup> Street - meets the criteria for a speed hump.
- Between 18<sup>th</sup> Street and 21<sup>st</sup> Street - meets the criteria for a speed hump.

I regret to inform you that all blocks do not meet the criteria for a speed hump:

- Between 8<sup>th</sup> Street and 9<sup>th</sup> Street – The placement of a speed hump stipulate a minimum of two hundred feet [200'] from a stop control device such as a traffic control signal or a STOP sign.
- Between 12<sup>th</sup> Street and 14<sup>th</sup> Street – The placement of a speed hump stipulate a minimum of two hundred feet [200'] from a stop control device such as a traffic control signal or a STOP sign.

Therefore, to ensure that general community support exists, I am forwarding this location to Florence Koulouris of Community Board (1) for their consideration prior to the installation of the speed hump. In the event Community Board (1) supports this request, installation will take place when resources are available.
