Dear Mr. Khuzami:

This is in response to your May 8, 2015 request for the installation of a speed hump on 18<sup>th</sup> Street between Hoyt Avenue and Astoria Boulevard.

Following an investigation of all the blocks, I am pleased to inform you that 18<sup>th</sup> Street:

- Between 25<sup>th</sup> Road and 26<sup>th</sup> Avenue meets the criteria for a speed hump.
- Between 26<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 26<sup>th</sup> Road meets the criteria for a speed hump.

I regret to inform you that all blocks do not meet the criteria for a speed hump:

- Between Hoyt Avenue and 9<sup>th</sup> Street The placement of numerous curb cuts prevent the safe installation of speed humps.
- Between 26<sup>th</sup> Road and 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue This block is too short to provide adequate distance from the intersections for motorists to safely reduce their speed to the advisory speed for crossing the bump.
- Between 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Astoria Boulevard The placement of a speed hump stipulate a minimum of two hundred feet [200'] from a stop control device such as a traffic control signal or a STOP sign.

Therefore, to ensure that general community support exists, I am forwarding this location to Florence Koulouris of Community Board (1) for their consideration prior to the installation of the speed hump. In the event Community Board (1) supports this request, installation will take place when resources are available.
