ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Nestled along the shores of the East River, the Astoria Waterfront Arts District (AWAD) derives its roots from the established art institutions located in Old Astoria, ones which ultimately define the community in its entirety. The district is bordered by Goodwill Park to the north, 14th Street to the East, Rainey Park to the south, and the East River to the west. From Socrates Sculpture Park to the Welling Court Mural Project, artistic diversity is on full display for those individuals living within the community, as well as non-residents who come out to witness the mesmerizing pieces. The district houses hundreds of graffiti artists, abstract painters, sculptors, muralists and many more who contribute to the artistic landscape of the community.

OUR CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS

Diversity is the banner of the cultural institutions that define AWAD. Art is presented in differentiating forms by individuals who interpret the world through distinct feelings, opinions, views and perceptions. The organizations that embody the district, amongst others, are Socrates Sculpture Park, Noguchi Museum, Welling Court Mural Project, Mark Di Suvero Studio, and Paper Mache Monkey. These institutions exhibit art in divergent shapes and forms. The Socrates Sculpture Park serves as an outdoor museum and public park where artists can fabricate and exhibit sculptures, the Noguchi Museum showcases sculptures, architectural models, stage designs and


furniture designs by Isamu Noguchi and other artists, while the Welling Court Mural Project pools together spectacular crews of legendary and groundbreaking artists who transformed the physical nature of the area into a creative celebration and public art experience. In addition, the Mark Di Suvero Studio offers dynamic sculptures largely made from industrial steel, each weighing many tons, while Paper Mache Monkey is changing the face of stage design and prop fabrication within the theatre arts.

VALUE TO THE COMMUNITY

Art serves as the social glue within AWAD, integrating and highlighting the multi-culturalism of the community. The reverence of the art institutions is equaled only by the warmth and inviting nature of area residents. The art presented through different institutions not only unifies the local surroundings, but also attracts individuals from different parts of the world who travel to Astoria to observe and expand on the districts works.

COMMITMENT TO DIVERSITY

Diversity is the bedrock of the AWAD community. Within its borders the neighborhood is experiencing a demographic shift towards greater multiculturalism and ethnic diversity. This shift exposes new generations and cultures to the creative inspirations of different groups, and opens up a dialogue to build the future of art in New York City.

SOCRATES SCULPTURE PARK

Socrates Sculpture Park is an outdoor museum and public park where artists can create and exhibit sculptures and multi-media installations. It is located one block from the Noguchi Museum at the intersection of Broadway and Vernon Boulevard. In addition to exhibition space, the park offers an arts education program, artist residency program, and job training. The four acre site is the largest outdoor space in New York City dedicated to exhibiting sculpture. GrowNYC runs an Astoria Farmer's Market in the park every Saturday during the summer months.

WELLING COURT MURAL PROJECT

The Welling Court Mural Project began in 2009 when Ad Hoc Art was invited by the community of Welling Court to slay some aesthetic blights in their neighborhood. The first project debuted in May 2010 with over 44 murals, fitting for the diverse and lively inhabitants. Each year since, spectacular crews of legendary and groundbreaking artists have come together to transform the neighborhood into a creative celebration and public art experience. Now featuring over 150 murals painted by artists from all corners of the globe, the Welling Court Mural Project is one of the best collections of contemporary graffiti and street art on earth.

THE NOGUCHI MUSEUM

The Noguchi Museum, chartered as The Isamu Noguchi Foundation and Garden Museum, was designed and created by the Japanese-American sculptor Isamu Noguchi. Opening on a limited basis to the public in 1985 the purpose of the museum and foundation was and remains to preserve and display Noguchi's sculptures, architectural models, stage designs, drawings, and furniture designs. The two-story, 24,000 square feet (2,200 m2) museum and adjacent sculpture garden, Socrates Sculpture Park, underwent major renovations in 2004 allowing the museum to stay open year round.

MARK di SUVERO STUDIO

Abstract expressionist sculptor Mark di Suvero's New York studio occupies a complex of warehouses on a beautiful stretch of the Astoria Waterfront in Queens. Mark di Suvero often works on an architectural, monumental scale, creating spatially dynamic sculptures largely from industrial steel I-beams, each weighing many tons. His primary tools are the crane, the cherry picker, and cutting and welding torches. The studio, which opens onto the East River, and consists of maze of studios, workshops, artist lofts and galleries, is a world unto itself, and speaks to the artist's interests in artinto-life, interactivity, and community.

TRANSPORTATION

Astoria Waterfront Arts District is easily accessable through a variety of different modes of transportation

The Astoria Waterfront Arts District's (AWAD) transportation network provides multiple means of conveyance throughout the New York City metropolitan area. From the heavy concentration of buses and trains in the district's vicinity to the newly opened Astoria ferry terminal, AWAD offers a variety of easy commuting options from borough to borough - and beyond.

TRAINS

Less than a 10-minute walk from AWAD, N and W trains are located at both the Broadway and 30th Avenue stations.

BUSES

The Astoria Waterfront Arts District offers more than eight varying bus routes connecting patrons to different neighborhoods, train stations, and airports, including the Q18, Q19, Q102, Q103, Q104, Q69, Q100, and M60 Select Bus Service.

FERRY

Located within the district, the Astoria ferry terminal provides access to AWAD from all five boroughs, including direct stops at Roosevelt Island, Long Island City, 34th Street and Wall Street in Manhattan.

ROADWAYS

AWAD can be accessed via the Grand Central Parkway, Triborough Bridge, Roosevelt Bridge, Pulaski Bridge, Queensboro Bridge, and the Midtown Tunnel.

AIRPORTS

Visitors coming to AWAD from LaGuardia Airport and JFK Airport will have 10-minute and 30-minute commutes, respectively.

CITIBIKE

AWAD enjoys eight Citibike stations in the district, and over 40 bike stations in the greater Astoria area.
